Join the August Pursuit Race for cruising boats this coming Tuesday

While the one design fleets wrap up their seasons this weekend, the Cruising Class will have their final Pursuit Race of the season Tuesday, August 25th. All cruising boats are

Pursuit Race, August 25, 2020

Notice of Race & Sailing Instructions

The 2020 August Pursuit Race is scheduled to be held Tuesday, August 25, under the auspices of the Kollegewidwok Yacht Club (KYC). The race will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020 including US Sailing Prescriptions, unless modified by these Sailing Instructions.

Boats will compete using PHRF Time on Distance handicapping in a Pursuit Race format (boats start in a sequence from slowest to fastest). Participants should have a current PHRF handicap certificate. PHRF Ratings for this race may be assigned or adjusted at the discretion of the KYC Race Committee.

The skippers' meeting (a single person from each boat due to Covid 19) will be held at 1100 hours on Tuesday, August 25 at KYC, at which time the race course will be announced. The starting line will be located approximately 0.75 nautical miles south of the entrance to Blue Hill harbor. All participants will monitor VHF channel 72 and check in with the Committee Boat prior to their start. The starting sequence for the first boat will begin at approximately 1230 hours. Given this year's boat crews may necessarily have a single handed or family make-up due to Covid 19, the Race Committee/Cruising Class Captain may designate the race as a no spinnaker race at the time of the skippers' meeting to encourage and/or facilitate participation.

Abandonment and Change of Finish Line:

The Race will be abandoned if the first boat does not cross the finish line by 1700 hours. The Race Committee may shorten course by establishing a finish line between the Committee Boat and a government mark or a modified finish line on or near the rhumb line of a leg of the course. The latter will consist of an imaginary line perpendicular to the rhumb line of the leg passing through the Committee Boat, which should be left to starboard and close at hand. Abandonment or change in course will be announced on VHF channel 72.

Government Marks:

All government marks except those which are marks of the course shall be observed.

KYC Covid 19 Protocol Update: The social distancing protocol applies to boats participating in KYC races; crew members are to wear a face covering whenever closer together than 6'. If a boat's crew is all from the same family/household (pod), face coverings are not required while racing.
