While only two boats showed up for each fleet, it was a beautiful and interesting day of racing for the annual Danforth and Gitana Cups. Congratulations to Patrick Wilmerding's Rascal for winning the Danforth and Nigel Purvis's Fidelio for the Gitana.

With a very gusty and shifty north–northwesterly, the two fleets started downwind together towards the top of Long Island, the bottom of Newbury Neck, and the top of Bartlett Island. There, they split, with the Gitana boats rounding Black Island to port for the beat home, while the Danforth boats headed down the Bartlett Narrows in a very challenging reach, given the tight quarters.

Rascal had a long and interesting beat back up the west side of Bartlett Island before rounding the top of Long Island for yet another beat to the finish. Unfortunately, the newest boat in the fleet, Jose Soriano's snazzy Maree Haute

Django 770, Amihan, became hopelessly entangled with some pot warps in the Narrows and had to withdraw. Butler Smythe's Crow was the second finisher in the Gitana.

This is a service offered to all members.

How it works:

Place your order in the store before 3:00 pm and the item will arrive around 9:00 am the next business day, *as long as it is in stock*. All orders would need to be placed through the store. The store is located behind the clubhouse. Kelly is happy to do this via email (followed up by a call), phone, or in person. There is a Hamilton catalog in the store if needed.

The items do not cost the member more than what the parts are priced at in the catalog. There is no surcharge for the delivery from Hamilton, as they are giving the club a small discount for having one ordering location. It makes it easier for Hamilton as well as convenient for our Club.
